### **Aim of the course**

The course “**Public Health in Colombia**” aims to contribute to a better understanding of public health in Colombia in an international, inter-disciplinary and inter-cultural perspective. The aim of the course is to broaden the knowledge of professionals, within the field of Public Health, and others interested in the subject.

### **¿How will the course be developed?**

The course has two parts: the *first one*, consists of three lecture series modules and/or seminars that will be taught in the mornings mainly by the Public Health Institute academic staff. To meet the inter-disciplinary demands of the curriculum, The Public Health Institute engages teaching staff from other faculties or academic units such as medicine, law, and social sciences, with a broad professional expertise in the thematic line in particular, and the *second one* through site visits in the afternoons. To fulfill this part, we engage outside collaborators extensively with stakeholders in public health practice and other public institutions (see the schedule of the course).

Case studies will be presented on the research projects carried out and/or on the other hand, in development with the Public Health Institute and with other academic units at PUJ, to allow students a better contextualization of public health in Colombia, through the practical application of the knowledge learned during the lectures.

The course will cover the following thematic lines in Colombian context exclusively: The history of the Colombian Armed Conflict and its impact on public health in Colombia, the National Healthcare System in Colombia and its evolution, Population demographics and disease burden in Colombia, the Ten-year Public Health Plan (PDSP 2012-2021), the mental health status of Colombian civilians and ex-combatants and Injury Prevention and Control.

### **Prospective student profile**

This course will be aimed at international students from the United States and the United Kingdom within the field of Public Health recruited through the Red Tree study, and others interested in the subject (master public health students).

### **Assessment**

A "Certificate of Completion of Attendance" for the course will be awarded for Students who attended at least 80% of the lectures, seminars, tutorials, and site visits.

<p><b>Andrés Felipe Cubillos Novella</b></p>	<p>Dentist, Master's in Social Policy at the Pontificia Universidad Javeriana. European Master in Migrations, Conflicts and Social Cohesion and Doctor in International and Intercultural Studies from the University of Deusto. Experience in consulting with international organizations in the formulation of public policies based on evidence, through the Pan American Health Organization. At the <i>national level</i>, with the Department of Health and Social Protection in the formulation of policies for the Vice principal of Non-Transmissible Diseases, and in the evaluation of instruments for the monitoring of healthy lifestyles in the national territory. In the District Department of Health, through the construction, validation and consultation with local stakeholders, of the district mental health policies. In the National Administrative Department of Statistics (DANE) in the construction of instruments for the analysis of international migrations. With the Administrative Department of Social Welfare, through the participative construction of the public policy for families living in Bogota. Finally, in the Foreign Affairs Department, participating in the construction of the guidelines at different levels for the formulation of the integral social policy focused on the Colombian population that has returned to the city of Bogota, through processes of consensus and participation, with experts and returnees.</p> <p>He is an assistant professor at Institute of Public Health at the Universidad Javeriana. He has focused on academic coordination, teaching and research in the Master's in Public health, Master's in Health and Social Security Administration and the Master's in Social Policy. Internationally, he has worked as Director of the Observatory of Public Policies for Latin America (OPPAL) and of the Revista A-MÉRICA, and the UNESCO Chair of Human Resources Training for Latin America `coordinator of the Universidad de Deusto. Invited professor by the universities of Pernambuco, Mar del Plata and Leeds.</p>
<p><b>Andres Ignacio Vecino Ortiz</b></p>	<p>He is an M.D. from the School of Medicine at the Universidad Javeriana, and M.A. in economics at Universidad de Los Andes in Colombia and a PhD in Health Systems and Health Economics from the Department of International Health of Johns Hopkins University. Over the last 13 years, Andres has held different research and academic positions in global health economics including a research fellow at the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation at the University of Washington in Seattle. Andres' main field of research is on the economics of prevention activities. Such research interest has allowed him to be involved in a myriad of different topics such as road safety and injuries, "healthy" taxes, mental health and alcohol consumption, stress, chronic diseases, health insurance, workplace insurance, pharmaco-economics, and child and maternal health. Andres has become particularly interested in the translation of research for policy-makers to enable them with tools to prioritize and take decisions in current policy issues.</p> <p>Andres is an assistant professor at the Institute of Public Health of Universidad Javeriana in Bogota, Colombia.</p>

<p><b>Angélica María Vargas Monroy</b></p>	<p>She is an assistant professor at the Institute of Public Health of Universidad. She is a psychologist with postgraduate studies in occupational health and a master's degree in public health. Angélica has experience in teaching, research and consulting activities in mental health and psychosocial factors. She has participated in projects of: design and validation of instruments for evaluating psychosocial risk factors applicable to the Colombian population and in formulation of guidelines and protocols for psychosocial intervention. Since 2016, Angélica has joined a research macro-project on post-conflict, peacebuilding and health, studying: the implications that post-conflict scenarios have on health systems, the impact of a training program to strengthen the capacities of health professionals to manage strategies aimed at addressing and promoting the mental health of vulnerable populations, and the use of media strategies to strengthen mental health and community resilience in populations affected by the armed conflict at Colombia.</p>
<p><b>Catalina Gonzalez Uribe</b></p>	<p>She is an associate professor of public health at the School of Medicine of Universidad de Los Andes, Bogota, Colombia. Currently, she leads the development of post-graduate programs in epidemiology and is a member of the Public Health, Education and Professionalism research group. Conducts research on social inequalities in sexual and reproductive health indicators, particularly Sustainable Development Goals agenda. Directed the scientific components of family planning, fertility preferences and maternal health of the 2015 Demographic and Health Survey DHS for Colombia. Passionate about interdisciplinary work, the development of social indicators and intercultural health research. Co-Founder of Ensamble, Consultancy group that promotes social change through research on equity, inclusion and human, social and environmental well-being. Member of the Urban Health Research Network in Latin America SALURBAL. Studied anthropology, psychology and a master in Anthropology at Universidad de Los Andes; MSc in Social Epidemiology and a Doctorate in Epidemiology and Public Health at University College London. Dreams of becoming an international Public Health leader in sexual and reproductive health research and advocacy.</p>
<p><b>Diana Isabel Cárdenas Gamboa</b></p>	
<p><b>Esther De Vries</b></p>	<p>Biologist with a PhD in Epidemiology and Public Health, associate professor of clinical epidemiology at the department of Clinical Epidemiology and Biostatistics of the Universidad Javeriana and assistant professor of Cancer surveillance at the department of Public Health of Erasmus MC in Rotterdam. Currently, she is the director of the Doctoral programme in Clinical Epidemiology of the department of Clinical Epidemiology and Biostatistics of the Universidad Javeriana. In 2000, she began her PhD training on epidemiological aspects related to malignant melanoma in Europe. She obtained her PhD degree in 2004 and continued working in cancer-related research at the department of Public Health of Erasmus MC. Due to the population nature of her research, she has built strong national and international networks of collaborators and have developed needed skills in team leadership and</p>

	<p>administration of complex research projects. She has been closely collaborating with cancer researchers from Colombia and other Latin American countries since 2008. In 2013, she was granted a Transfer of Expertise grant by the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC), allowing her to transfer and expand her skills to Latin America, with a specific focus on Colombia. This subsequently led to an appointment as Associate Director of Research, Surveillance, Prevention and Promotion at the Colombian National Cancer Institute (INC), the government agency in charge of cancer control in Colombia. Since 2015, she is employed at the Universidad Javeriana.</p> <p>Her main research interest resides on cancer epidemiology, particularly on the patterns of distribution of cancer incidence, mortality, and risk factors across large populations. She has connected population-based cancer burden data with data on prevalence of risk factors, changes in treatment, diagnostics and policies to evaluate progress made against cancer in the Netherlands and help setting priorities for cancer prevention and informing policy makers. Currently, she is pursuing similar research in Colombia and South America.</p>
<p><b>Fernando Ruiz Gómez</b></p>	<p>He is an M.D. from the School of Medicine at the Universidad Javeriana, a MPH in Occupational Health at Harvard University, a M.A. in Economics at Universidad Javeriana and a PhD in Public Health from the Mexican National Institute of Public Health. He served as a health consultant for institutions like the World Bank, and the InterAmerican Development Bank (BID) through the Regional Public Goods, and a regional coordinator of the Secretary of Health of Bogotá, among others. He was director of Projects of Italian Technical Cooperation and Fellow of Harvard University. He was director of the Center for Projects for Development (CENDEX) of the Javeriana University for several years, and an associate professor in the same university. After leaving CENDEX position, from 2013 to 2016, he was appointed as the Vice Minister of Health. Currently, he is the scientific director of the Hospital of Treatment and Cancer Research, Luis Carlos Sarmiento – CTIC. He continues to teach in the Health Economy Master's program at Javeriana University.</p>

Master in Analysis of Political and International Relations Contemporary Problems of the "Externado" University of Colombia and the Institute of High Studies for Latin America of Paris.
